We are always looking at the best way to take care of one's car. This issue focuses on the proper care of tyres to avoid the inconvenience of a flat tyre or the danger of a burst tyre as you travel.

1. Maintain proper inflation of tyres- a properly inflated tyre determines maximum performance of the car. It is therefore necessary to check tyres at least once a month with a functional tyre pressure gauge. The best time to do this is when the tyre is cool.

2. It is important to maintain tyre pressure at the correct levels. Under inflation of the tyres may lead to irreparable tyre damage as there is a great amount of rubber in contact with the road leading to increased friction, which can lead to overheating. This causes premature wear and tyre of the tyre or even a blow out of the tyre. By the same token over-inflated tyres are more stiff and inflexible which makes them vulnerable to damage from potholes, curbs or debris.

3. Avoid excessive tyre spinning when the car is stuck in mud or sand. This can lead to tyres overheating and will cause stress to the rubber leading to a shorter tyre life. Rather use a forward and backward rocking motion to free the car.

4. Always check the tyre for wear and tear and remove the tyres when they reach the 1.6mm tread depth. If the tyres go beyond the 1.6mm depth they should be replaced.

5. Carry out monthly tyre checks to detect any damage, bulges, cracks and knots.

6. Check and monitor the tyre pressure monitoring system alert which appears on the dashboard for an indication of any tyre pressure problems

7. Do not mix different tyre sizes - you need to check for the size recommended by the vehicle manufacturer. It is also important to fit tyres of the same speed ratings.

8. Rotate tyres as per the tyre manufacturer's recommendation or every 10 000kilometres.

9. Do not overload the vehicle. It is important to check the vehicle's load limits. If the vehicle is overloaded this can cause stress to tyres and the vehicle components in general.

WINTER DRIVING TIPS

As winter is fast approaching and temperatures are **Tyres** getting lower, here are a few tips to help take care of . your vehicles during the cold months:

Battery care

- Ensure that the battery is in good condition and make sure that it has enough battery water- do not use tap water as this compromises the performance of the battery.
- Clean the battery terminals with warm water and remove dust and acid build up
- Secure the battery properly so that there are no loose connections
- Check the alternator belts for fraying or cracking

Tyres need to be in good condition and need to have proper treads in order to grip the road- this is essential as there tends to be rain during the Zimbabwe winter months which causes roads to be slippery.

Lights

- Days are shorter during winter and some morn ings are gloomy and misty. It is essential that the car's lights work properly
- Remember to switch off lights at the end of the journey as car batteries get flat when switched on for a long time when the car is not running

Windscreen wipers

If the car is parked outside, there might be a layer of frost on the windscreen. Do not use warm water to remove the frost as the contrast in temperature might lead to the windscreen cracking. Use a scrapper to take off the frost- an old bank card will do the trick

Use the car's air conditioner to demist the car interior's windows as this has a more complete finish than using your hand or cloth

KILO KING & REVENUE KING




